



*Your natural stone, like any other part of your garden or home, requires some periodic maintenance to keep it in tip top condition, however this need not be time consuming or expensive. We have put together this maintenance guide to give you all the information you need to know.*

The appeal of Reclaimed Yorkstone is in the unique patina and weathered surface. This distinguishes it from newly quarried stone. Abrasive cleaning methods (using chemicals, soaps, detergents or a jetwash, for example) will remove the patina from the surface and so should be avoided wherever possible.

Brush the stone regularly with a stiff brush to remove any dried mud or dirt and to prevent the accumulation of detritus in the joints. Occasionally leaves and other organic matter can leave a mark if allowed to decompose on the surface of the stone so it is important to ensure that any falling leaves are brushed away regularly.

If necessary, the stone can be cleaned periodically with water and a stiff brush. Spot stains from berries, bird droppings etc. can also be cleaned with water and a brush.
